- Expert reports on fossil sites and plant fossil sites



The report - background

- The Australian Heritage Council commissioned palaeontologists to conduct a comparison of outstanding fossil sites
- The Council commissioned a report that provided a comparison of the most important plant fossil sites nationally
- The reports were combined to produce Australia's fossil heritage: A
 catalogue of important Australian fossil sites



The report - aims



- To provide a reference for Heritage Division of many of the outstanding fossils sites of Australia
- To provide Heritage Division with comparative information
- A starting point for future assessments

The report - our approach

- Representatives from each state and the Northern Territory selected 10 fossil sites.
- Each representative also chose three outstanding fossil sites from anywhere in Australia for comparative analysis.




 The sites were limited to those that have not yet had their values recognised through National or World Heritage Listing

- key references




Fossil remains at Riversleigh, Queensland


The report - outcomes

- The fossil report contains summaries for 77 fossil sites
- Contributors took different approaches to the guidelines
- Sites might reflect both sample bias and their area of expertise
- Distinguishing between heritage value and scientific value


From report to publication

Heritage Division has worked with CSIRO Publishing to produce heritage publications previously






The publication – aims




- •Give the public access to information that is not available elsewhere
